## RESPONSIVE READING OF THE LAW

The words of Jesus from the Gospels

And God spoke all these words, saying, "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. You shall have no other gods before me.

**It is written: "Worship the Lord your God and serve him only."**

You shall not make for yourself an idol.

**God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in spirit and in truth.**

You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God.

**"Do not swear at all: either by heaven, for it is God's throne; or by the earth, for it is his footstool...Let your 'Yes' be 'Yes', and your 'No' be 'No'; anything beyond this comes from the evil one."**

Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.

**The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. So the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath.**

Honor your father and your mother.

**For God said, "Anyone who curses his father or mother must be put to death."**

You shall not murder.

**Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be sons of your Father in heaven.**

You shall not commit adultery.

**Anyone who looks at a woman lustfully has already committed adultery with her in his heart.**

You shall not steal.

**For out of the heart come evil thoughts, murder, adultery...theft...These are what make a man "unclean."**

You shall not give false testimony.

**For out of the overflow of the heart the mouth speaks...For by your words you will be acquitted, and by your words you will be condemned.**

You shall not covet.

**Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; a man's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions.**
